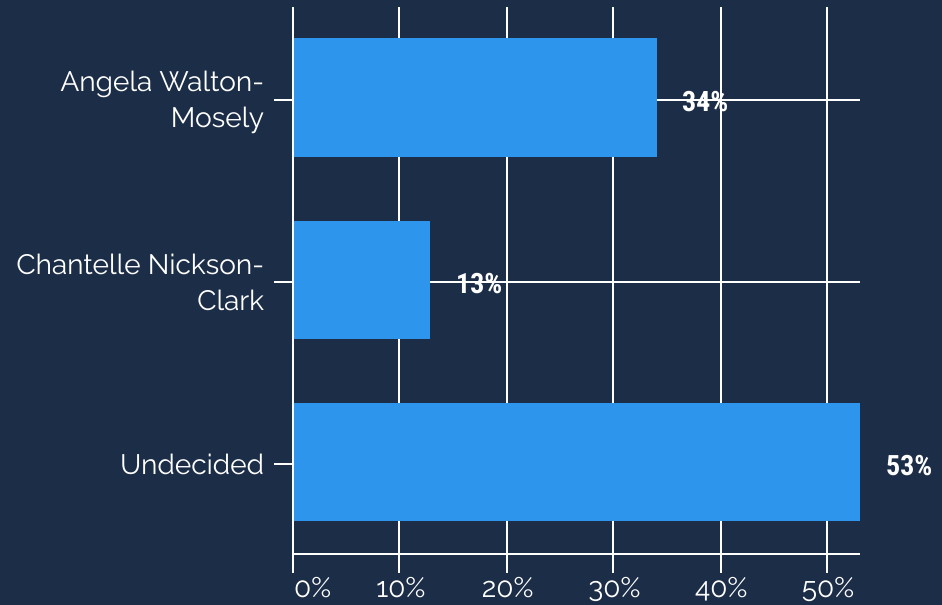
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## **Missouri State Senate District 13**

Survey conducted April 30 to May 2, 2024. 300 likely 2024 Democratic Primary voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2024 Democratic Primary Election. Margin of Error is +/-5.6% with a 95% level of confidence. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding. Survey conducted by Remington Research Group on behalf of The Missouri Scout.

Q1: Candidates in the Democratic primary for Missouri State Senate District 13 are Angela Walton-Mosely and Chantelle Nickson-Clark. If the primary election were held today, for whom would you vote?

Angela Walton-Mosely: 34%  
 Chantelle Nickson-Clark: 13%  
 Undecided: 53%

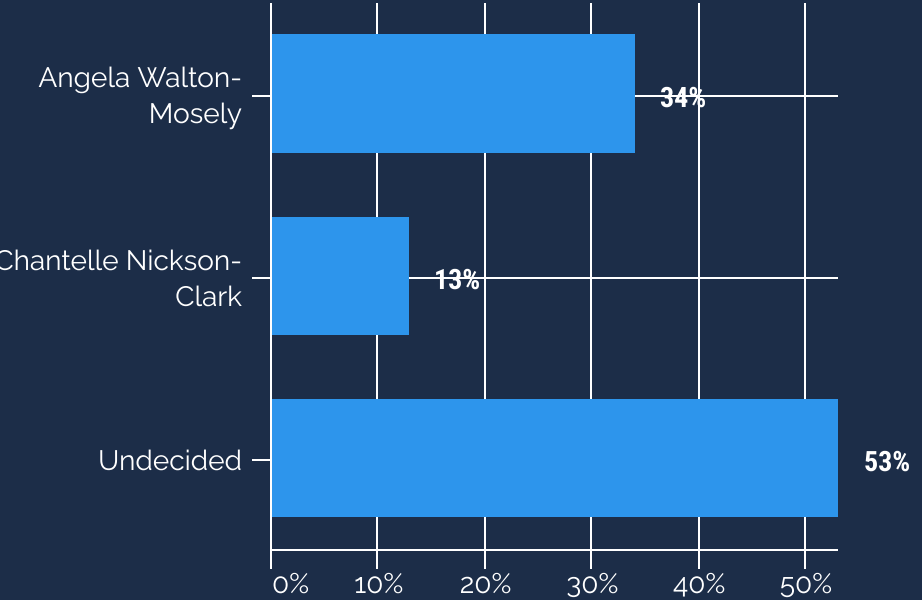

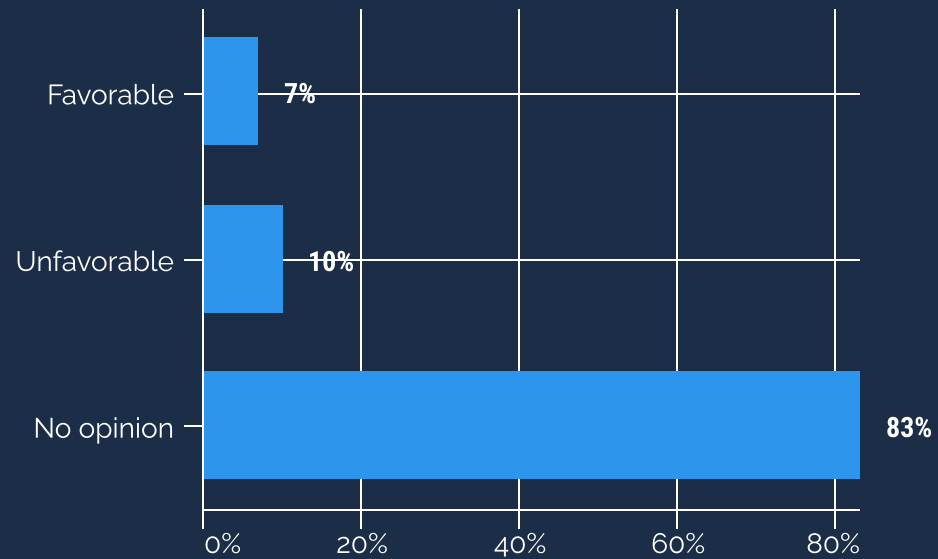

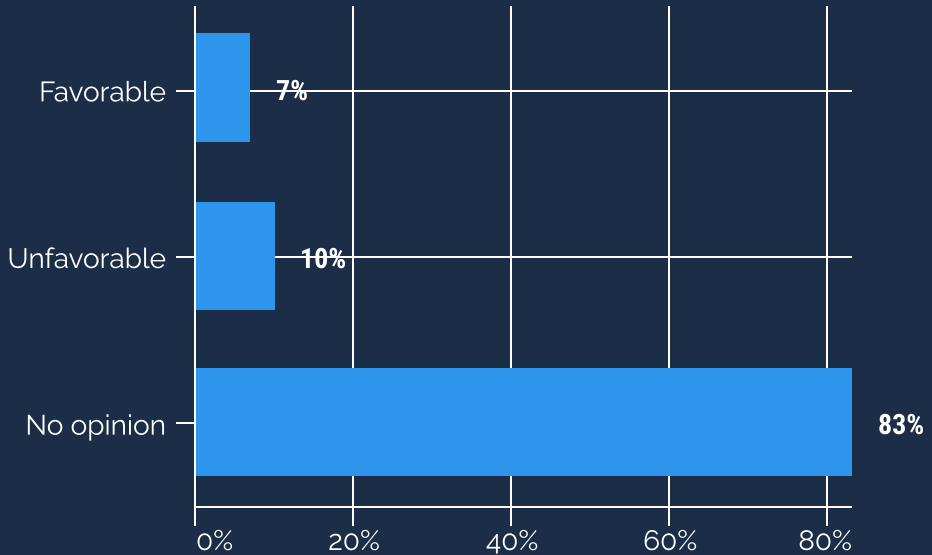

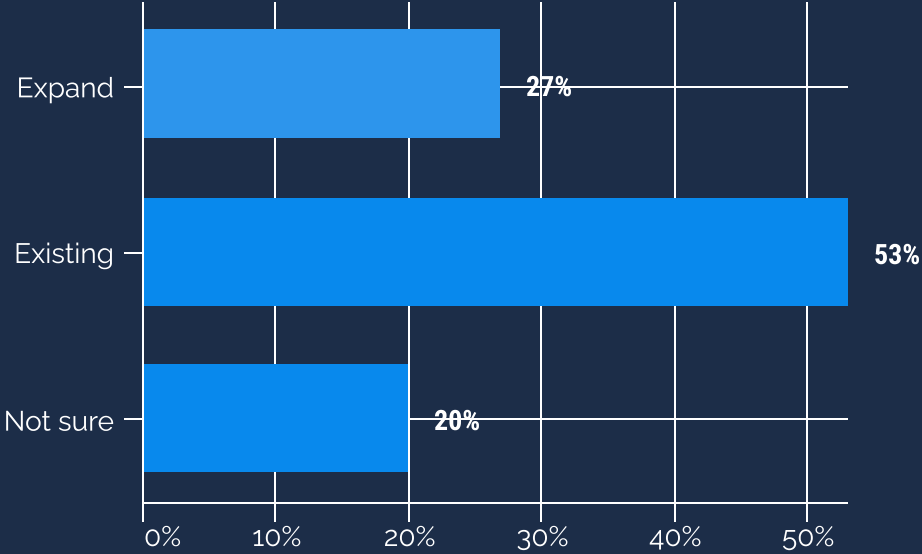

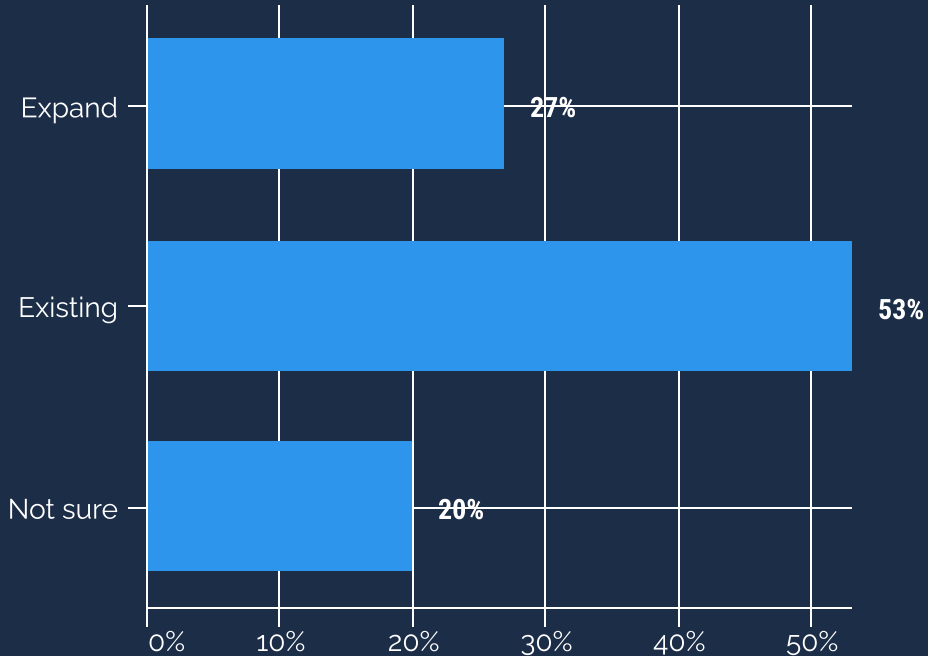

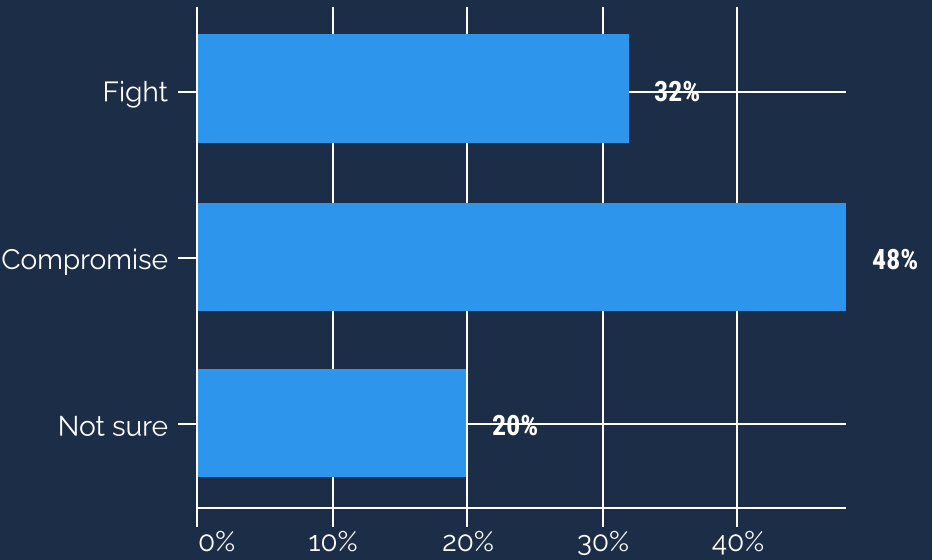

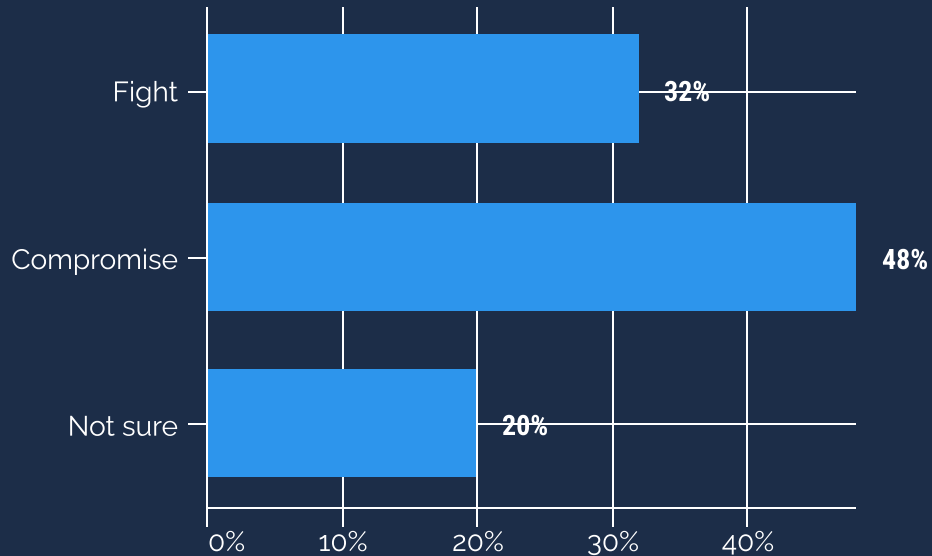
